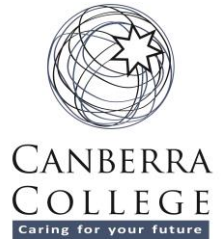

Psychology

The study of Psychology provides a comprehensive understanding of individuals, families and communities. Psychology explores common human experiences both across and within cultures. It promotes objective thinking and evidence-based research, drawing on various methods of enquiry as the basis for exploring, understanding and interpreting human behaviour. Psychology provides a repertoire of research methodology, analysis and communication skills vital for careers that involve working with people.

Sociology

Students undertaking Sociology will develop skills in analytical and critical thinking and learn to question and challenge assumptions about human behaviour. Sociology is highly relevant to further studies in the health professions, education, human resources, social sciences, sales, media, community services, marketing and management. Knowledge from Sociology can be applied to society as a whole, helping us understand how individuals' function within different contexts and how this is influenced by culture, values, attitudes and beliefs.

Social and Community Work

This course is designed for students interested in exploring a range of social and community service sectors including Children's services, Disability work. Aged care, Youth work. It focuses on the fundamental skills and underpinning knowledge to pursue further training and work in a range of careers that involve working with people. Work in the community services industry reflects a complex inter-relationship of duty of care, ethical behaviours, personal values and service delivery standards.
